

# Use of Pupil Premium

## Current and Historic PPG

The most up-to-date information shows that at the end of academic year 2017 17.2% of the total school population are, or have been, entitled to claim 'Free School Meals' (FSM) at some time in the last six years during their primary school education. The entitlement figure has been fairly stable up until this year but is now starting to show gradual signs of decline. In the financial year 2017/18 the school received a total grant of £108940.

## Data Analysis

There were 11 PPG pupils in the 2017 Y6 cohort. This represented 18% of the cohort of 61 pupils. From 2016 no national data for PPG performance has been published, therefore there are no figures provided to directly compare this group to other children who are eligible for PPG. In each category they have been compared to the overall national pass rate.

## Reading, Writing and Maths Combined

42% of Ings Farm PPG children (5 pupils) in 2017 passed the combined measure of Reading/Writing/Maths at 'Expected Standard' and no children achieved the 'High Standard'. This compares to a national pass rate of 61% 'Expected Standard' and 9% 'High Standard' for all children.

## Reading

Of the 12 PPG children, 75% (9 pupils) achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 17% (2 pupils) achieved the 'High Standard' in Reading in 2017 compared to a national figure of 71% and 25% respectively.

## Writing

Of the 12 PPG children, 42% (5 pupils) achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 0% (0 pupils) achieved the 'Greater Depth' grade in Writing in 2017 compared to a national pass rate of 76% and 18% respectively.

## EGPS

Of the 12 PPG children, 83% (10 pupils) achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 17% (2 pupils) achieved the 'Greater Depth' grade in English grammar, punctuation and spelling in 2017 compared to a national pass rate of 77% and 31% respectively.

## Mathematics

Of the 12 PPG children, 75% (9 pupils) achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 0% (0 pupils) achieved the 'High Standard' in Mathematics in 2017 compared to a national figure of 75% and 23% respectively.
