

# Use of Pupil Premium

2018/19

## Current and Historic PPG

The most up-to-date information shows that at the end of academic year 2019 15% of the total school population are, or have been, entitled to claim 'Free School Meals' (FSM) at some time in the last six years during their primary school education. The entitlement figure had been stable but, in recent years, has started to show signs of decline. In the financial year 2018/19 the school received a total grant of £95140.

## Data Analysis

There were 16 PPG pupils in the 2019 Y6 cohort (3 boys and 13 girls). This represented 25% of the cohort of 62 pupils.

## Reading, Writing and Maths Combined

75% of Ings Farm PPG children) in 2019 achieved the combined measure of Reading/Writing/Maths at 'Expected Standard' and 12.5% achieved the 'High Standard'. This compares to a national pass rate of 64% at the 'Expected Standard' and 11% at the 'High Standard' for all children.

## Reading

Of the 16 PPG children, 81.3% achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 12.5% achieved the 'High Standard' in Reading in 2019 compared to a national figure of 73% and 27% respectively.

## Writing

Of the 16 PPG children, 87.5% achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 18.8% achieved the 'Greater Depth' grade in Writing in 2019 compared to a national pass rate of 78% and 20% respectively.

## EGPS

Of the 16 PPG children, 81.3% achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 25% achieved the 'Greater Depth' grade in English grammar, punctuation and spelling in 2019 compared to a national pass rate of 78% and 36% respectively.

## Mathematics

Of the 16 PPG children, 81.3% achieved the 'Expected Standard' and 25% achieved the 'High Standard' in Mathematics in 2019 compared to a national figure of 79% and 27% respectively.
